Known as the city of the Cento Guglie, Prague tries travelers with his incredible charm and his impressive architecture. The capital of the Czech Republic hosts dazzling churches, green parks and a mix of Italian, Czech and German design. Admire one of the most famous attractions, Prague begin.
